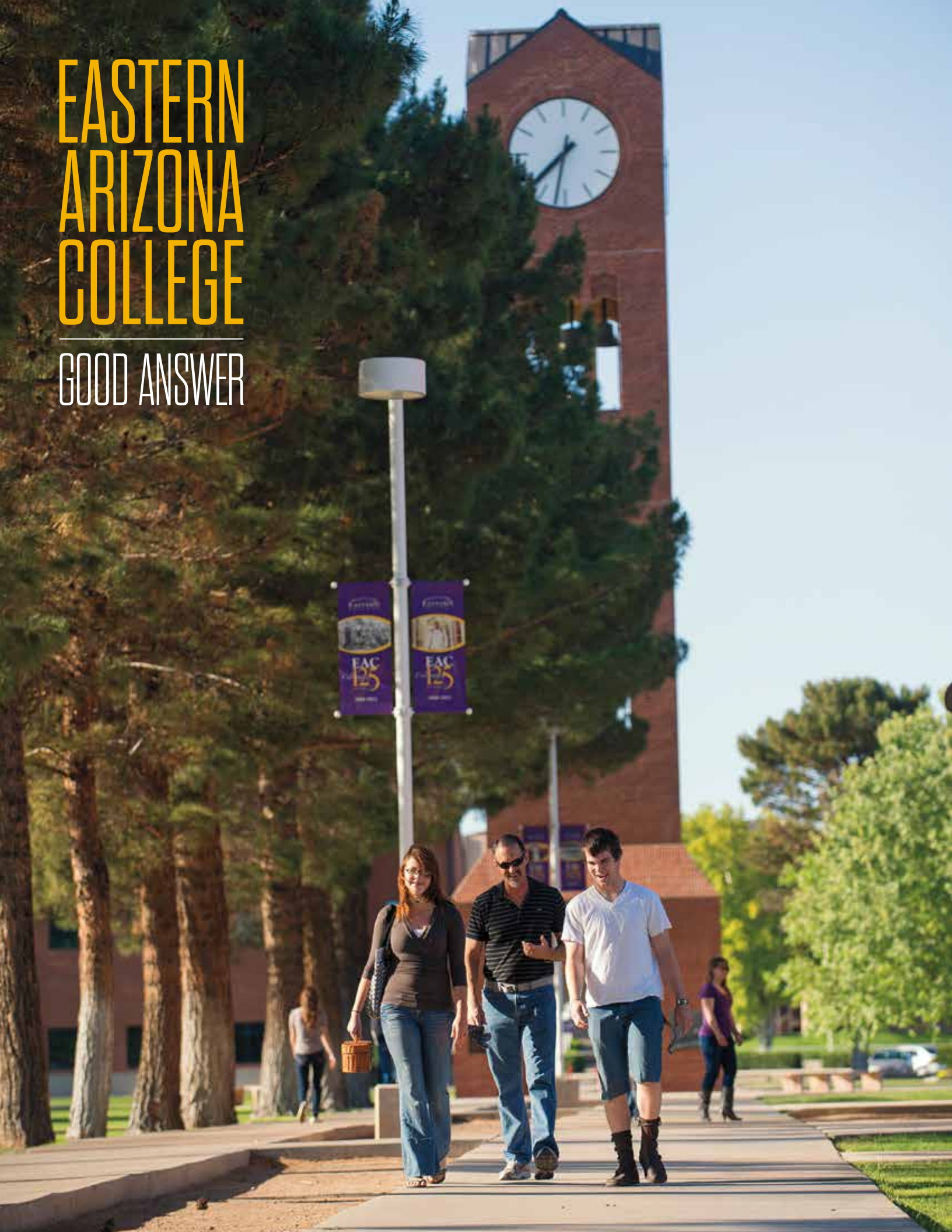

STEPS TO ENROLLING AT EAC

■ STEP 1: GET ADMITTED

Apply online at www.eac.edu or by phone at 928.428.8270.

■ STEP 2: ACTIVATE YOUR GILA HANK AND MONSTER MAIL

Once admitted, you'll receive official communications from EAC. Get started by visiting www.eac.edu/gilahank.

■ STEP 3: APPLY FOR FINANCIAL AID AND SCHOLARSHIPS

Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) online at www.fafsa.ed.gov before March 1 for priority consideration. The EAC online scholarship application is located in your Gila Hank account. The deadline for applications is March 1.

■ STEP 4: SECURING HOUSING

Go to www.eac.edu/housing to complete a Residence Hall Application and License Agreement and submit your \$150 deposit. Contact the Housing Office at 928.428.8605 to learn more about on- and off-campus options.

■ STEP 5: TAKE PLACEMENT TESTS

All degree-seeking students must take placement tests in math, writing and reading before enrolling. ACT or SAT scores may be used in lieu of placement testing if minimum scores are met in each subject area. Testing is offered by appointment Monday-Friday in the Counseling Office, which can be reached at 928.428.8253, option 0.

■ STEP 6: ACADEMIC ADVISING AND CLASS PLANNING

Contact the Counseling Office to get sound advice from our staff and to be in prime position to reach your academic goals.

■ STEP 7: REGISTERING FOR CLASSES

Registration, using your Gila Hank account, begins March 15 for the fall semester, and October 15 for the spring semester.

■ STEP 8: FINALIZE YOUR ACCOUNT

Contact the Fiscal Control Office at 928.428.8221 to confirm your payment for tuition, fees, and room and board has been received.

■ STEP 9: BUYING TEXTBOOKS

Purchase the books you need at the EAC Bookstore before classes start.

■ STEP 10: ATTEND MONSTER BRIDGE

Gather valuable information at this New Student Orientation experience, offered the week before fall semester begins. Register for CSL 120 Monster Bridge to participate.
