2. *If student is considering transferring to ASU and wants to be admitted as a major upon arrival, you are expected to complete either MAT160 or PSY220 – an Introduction to Statistics course. You may use this course as your math requirement.*
3. *Students are strongly encouraged to work with the academic advisor for this major in the selection of electives which will complement their future studies in Communication or another field.*
4. *Students who earn a 3.5 GPA on 9 cumulative hours in Communication Studies may be invited to become members of Sigma Chi Eta Honor Society – National Communication Association 2 year college Honor Society.*
