## Get an Early Start on College through EAC Dual Enrollment

Eastern Arizona College Dual Enrollment provides high school students courses that may be counted toward both high school and college graduation requirements. Dual Enrollment courses are college courses taught at the high school during regular school hours by faculty credentialed to teach at the college level. Credits earned may be transferred to other community colleges or universities.

Dual Enrollment is offered to high school juniors and seniors, and in some instances freshmen and sophomores, who meet EAC prerequisites.

### How to Enroll:

1. Meet with your high school counselor to be admitted
2. Activate your Gila Hank and Monster Mail Accounts
3. Take placement tests
4. Register for classes
5. Pay for classes
