College and Area Information:

Eastern Arizona College and Gila County Provisional Community College District have partnered to provide higher education services in Gila County at the Gila Pueblo Campus in Globe, Payson Campus, and other sites. Position Summary and Organizational Relationship:

The Masonry Instructor, ADC Prison Program reports to the Coordinator of Prison Programs. Funding for this position is contingent upon continuation of a contract with the Arizona Department of Corrections Rehabilitation and Re-entry and continuation of this position/program within that contract.

Required Qualifications:

- Five years verifiable occupational experience in the Masonry Trade
- Must pass extensive background checks by the Arizona Department of Corrections
- Must pass pre-employment drug screenings as required by the Arizona Department of Corrections
- Ability to work effectively in a high-security setting with a diverse group of individuals.
- Ability to effectively utilize computer programs and productivity tools for communication, record keeping, supplemental instruction, instructional preparation, etc.
- Must be willing and able to work a non-traditional evening schedule at Graham Prison.

Preferred Qualifications:

- AAS degree or higher in related field of study.
- Ability to work and interact effectively with Arizona Department of Corrections staff, College personnel, and students and be able to deal with the challenges and stress of a high security environment.
- Teaching experience in Masonry and the ability to relate to and address all levels of student preparation.
- Strong organizational and record keeping skills.
- Experience working in a high security environment with an all-male student body.

Essential Functions:

- Teach 20-25 incarcerated adult male students approximately 9 hours per week.
- Adhere to a work schedule determined by the contracting agency that will include training days.
- Teach entry level proficiencies in blueprint reading for masonry, Masonry I, II and III, and Concrete Work.
- Maintain true and accurate records reflecting student progress and achievement for all courses taught.
- Conduct and report on classroom assessment.
- Update course outlines, pre- and post-test and curriculum as needed.
- Comply with all Arizona Department of Corrections policies and procedures as well as all District policies and procedures.
