


The overall retention rate of full-time students from fall 2019 to fall 2020 is 40.4%, down from 61.9% last year. Peer comparison for Fall 2020 is pending.

The 150% of time graduation rate for the fall 2017 first-time, full-time cohort is 46%, up from 39.9% last year. This compares to a national average of 28.9% according to the National Community College Benchmarking Project.

The 150% of time graduation rate or transfer for the fall 2017 first-time, full-time cohort is 62.6%. This compares to a national average of 44.5% according to the National Community College Benchmarking Project.

Green indicates notably higher (>10%) retention, completion or completion/transfer rates as compared to aggregate. Red indicates notably lower (>-10%) retention, completion or completion/transfer rates as compared to aggregate.

Employees

Measures 1-8 are from the Personal Assessment of Collegiate Environment (PACE) Survey. There was a 39% response rate in 2018 (N=293). PACE 2021 scheduled for November.

Students

Measures 1-13 are from the Noel Levitz Survey. There was a 26% response rate in 2021 (N=132) Measure 14 is from the 2020 Graduate Exit Survey. There was a 24% response rate in 2017 (N=104)
