

A. VEHICULAR TRAFFIC

1. Definition

Vehicular traffic, as defined in ARS §28-101.59, is any device in, upon or by which any person or property is or may be transported or drawn upon a public highway, excepting devices moved by human power.

2. Parking Regulations

All campus parking shall be in accordance with existing state laws. All restricted parking areas shall be clearly identified.

- (a) No Parking Zones shall be identified by signs and/or a red painted curb. Parking shall not be permitted at any time, except for authorized emergency vehicles.
- (b) Staff Parking Zones shall be identified by signs and/or a yellow painted curb. Parking shall be restricted only to those vehicles bearing a valid "Staff Parking" permit.
- (c) Handicapped Parking Zones shall be identified by a blue and white handicapped sign and insignia painted on the parking spaces. Parking in these zones shall be restricted, at all times, and to vehicles bearing the official wheelchair symbol on the license plate, or an official handicap insignia attached to the vehicle. A vehicle with a disabled placard or license plate may be cited if a person other than the disabled driver is driving the vehicle, without the disabled person present in the vehicle.
- (d) Loading Zones shall be identified by signs and/or a white painted curb. Such zones are designated for delivery of large or heavy items by both college and non-college personnel. Parking instructions restricting use will be posted.
- (e) Special Zones may be designated. Special zones will be identified and instructions restricting use will be posted.

3. Driving Regulations

Traffic on all Eastern Arizona College campuses shall be subject to the posted speed limits, or if not posted, shall be limited to fifteen (15) miles per hour.

Entrance and exit signs and one-way directional arrows must be obeyed.

All driving within the campus parking lots shall be in a safe, reasonable, and prudent manner.

B. NON-PEDESTRIAN DEVICES

1. Definition

Non-pedestrian devices, as defined in ARS §15-1449(H), includes bicycles, tricycles, unicycles, skateboards, roller-skates and equines.

2. Regulations

No person shall ride a non-pedestrian device within the inter-sidewalk areas of the campuses. This includes all of the area within the public streets bordering campus sites, excluding the sidewalks adjacent to public streets, and which are under the jurisdiction of the City or County government.

Non-pedestrian devices shall not be ridden upon walkways, ramps, or stairways, on or within Eastern Arizona College buildings. Bicycles may, however, be pushed on the inter-sidewalk areas in order to gain access to bike racks or storage lockers.

All non-pedestrian devices being legally ridden on campus roadways must yield the right-of-way to pedestrians.

C. PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS

The enforcement of violations shall be the responsibility of Campus Security, under the direction of the College President or officials assigned by the College President.

At the discretion of Campus Security, violations of state laws or city ordinances shall be cited into the court having jurisdiction.

Violations of Graham County Community College District regulations shall be subject to fines and penalties as outlined in Section D.

Fines shall be paid within fourteen (14) calendar days from the date of the citation. Failure to pay the fine on or before the date stated on the citation will result in an additional late payment fee.

Unpaid fines shall be considered debts to Eastern Arizona College and are subject to collection procedures and charges in accordance with College policies regarding past due accounts. This includes, but is not limited to, withholding student grades and transcripts and possible withdrawal from classes.

Employees are expected to observe and comply with parking and traffic regulations relative to non-pedestrian traffic. Employees will be subject to the same fines and penalties as other individuals.

Vehicles that are illegally parked on campus may be towed away. Vehicles left unattended for more than two weeks may also be towed away if the owner cannot be contacted or refuses to remove the vehicle. The payment of any towing charges incurred for illegally parking on campus is the responsibility of the owner of the towed vehicle.

Non-pedestrian devices that are illegally ridden on campus may be impounded until all appropriately assessed fines and penalties are paid.
