Eastern Arizona College is committed to the protection of its students, employees and others who may conduct, or participate in research projects, including surveys, sponsored by or associated with the College. The Institutional Research (IR) Office and the Human Subjects Review Committee are charged with evaluating potential research projects to ensure that risks to any party are limited and they are in compliance with standards outlined by the Code of Federal Regulations, Title 45 (45 CFR Part 46) Protection of Human Subjects.

Anyone proposing to conduct research, including surveys, focus groups, or data collection at the College must first seek approval from the Office of Institutional Research prior to the initiation of the project. Additionally, college personnel who are conducting research in the community must also have their research projects reviewed and approved.

Some research projects or surveys may be exempt from review if they are conducted by a college faculty member in his/her classes, by departmental personnel within their own department, and if the data collected does not contain personally identifiable information.

Compliance is regulated by the Office for Human Subjects Protection (OHRP) at the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services.
