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The Graham County Community College District shall offer a program that meets the educational needs of the population it serves, and has established the following curricular standards to implement them.

- A. Occupational Curricula - The District shall offer occupational programs designed to lead to an associate degree. The District will also offer programs of shorter duration designed to lead to employment when an associate degree is not appropriate.
- B. Baccalaureate Parallel Curricula - The District shall offer baccalaureate parallel curricula of such quality and content that will permit transfer into third-year college classes in baccalaureate programs in senior colleges or universities.
 - 1. The District shall offer one or more curricula for each of the following baccalaureate parallel associate degrees meeting the criteria for the respective degree contained in the Report of the Task Force on Transfer Articulation dated October 30, 1996, which was approved by the Arizona Board of Regents on November 1, 1996, and accepted by the Joint Legislative Committee on December 4, 1996.
 - a. The Associate in Arts degree, which includes a general education component of at least 35 semester credit hours and, for the General Requirements version of the degree, includes fourth semester proficiency in a non-English language (not a computer language).
 - b. The Associate in Business degree, which includes a general education component of at least 35 semester hours.
 - c. The Associate in Science degree, which includes advanced mathematics requirements and a general education component of at least 35 semester credit hours.
 - 2. The District may offer one or more baccalaureate parallel associate degree curriculums which has been specially articulated with one or more universities to meet special transfer needs as described as having exceptional requirements in the Report of the Task Force on Transfer Articulation cited in Section 2.a above.
- C. Special Programs - The District shall offer such full-time and part-time or evening programs as are required by the particular educational and economic needs of the community and which can be provided economically. Programs may include, but are not limited to, community service programs, continuing or adult education and development programs.
- D. Testing and Guidance Programs - The District shall offer services for testing, guidance, and individual development.
- E. Specialized Educational Programs - The District Governing Board may authorize additional specialized educational programs as determined by community need.
