Plagiarism is offering another's work as one's own. It may occur in a variety of ways:

- A. Quoting without giving proper credit.
- B. Expanding someone else's work, whether a student's work or a professional's, without giving proper credit.
- C. Adopting an actual document, including an electronic document.
- D. Directly using someone's ideas, rather than words, without giving proper credit.

The consequences of plagiarism are serious and may result in failure of the plagiarized assignment and possible failure of the course. A student who is charged with plagiarism has the right to appeal through the College's Judiciary Appeals Committee.

Sometimes a student may commit plagiarism without intending to do so. Students have the responsibility of being sure they understand plagiarism in order to avoid it. Instructors will be happy to assist them.
