National Standardized Examinations

Students may be awarded college credit for satisfactory scores on national standardized examinations listed in the American Council on Education’s “A Guide to Educational Credit by Examination, 4th Edition,” or its successor. Copies of this document are on file with the offices of the Secretary of State.

The College Level Examination Program (CLEP) is an example of such an examination. Students may be awarded college credit through CLEP (EAC is an official test center) if they score 500 or above on each section, including English Composition with essay, of the General Examination or 50 or above on the subject exams. A list of equivalent courses is in the Catalog, "Academic Regulations" section. A description of tests is available at the Evaluation Unit. There is a fee for the CLEP exam.

Upon transfer, acceptance of credit awarded by means of a national standardized examination may be treated differently by the receiving institution.
